## **STUDENT SAFETY PATROLS**

The responsibility of preparing elementary school children to live responsibly and safely is one prime objective of our schools. School safety patrols may be established to further this objective.

The school safety patrol shall be an integral part of the total school safety program and shall have as its purposes:

1. To help educate children in where, how and when to cross streets enroute from school to home and from home to school, and at all other times
2. To influence students to refrain from crossing streets at points other than at corners or other regular crossings.
3. To provide opportunities for the development of character, leadership and cooperative school citizenship.

To be a member of the safety patrol is an honor and a privilege. Members of the patrol will be selected in accordance with their academic achievement, deportment, attitude and willingness to accept responsibility. The faculty advisor for the safety patrol will take applications and assist other faculty members and the administration in the selection of members.

The safety patrol will assist in supervising the bus loading area. Violators will be reported to the administration and faculty for appropriate action.

The faculty advisor will use the guidelines set by the safety department of the Wisconsin Division of AAA in organizing, training and implementing the safety patrol.
